A Love Even Greater

Can anything compare to a mother's love? There are few things in this world that are stronger than the love a mother has for her baby. She carries a child inside of her for all those months. During that time she will be conscious of what she eats and drinks and what she does because she does not want anything to harm her baby. She can feel that baby moving inside her. She knows she is carrying a precious life inside her. When she gives birth to that child, she has an attachment to that child that no one else will ever have. Fathers certainly love their children. But fathers probably can't fully understand the bond that mothers have with the child they carried inside themselves and then brought into the world.

No one would question the love that mothers have for their children. The Lord uses that truth in order to teach his people something important.

There would come a time in the Old Testament, when the Lord would allow his people to be conquered by their enemies and dragged into captivity. Though the people brought this judgment on themselves because of their sins, some would find fault with the Lord. In fact, some would even claim that the Lord had forgotten them. We are told, "But Zion said, 'The LORD has forsaken me, the Lord has forgotten me'" (Isaiah 49:14 NIV 84).

Nothing could be farther from the truth. The Lord immediately corrects that thought. He says, "Can a mother forget the baby at her breast and have no compassion on the child she has borne? Though she may forget, I will not forget you! See, I have engraved you on the palms of my hands; your walls are ever before me" (Isaiah 49:15-16 NIV 84). To emphasize the greatness and the certainty of his love, the Lord points people to the love a mother has for her child. No one would doubt a mother's love. Even more so, no one should ever doubt the Lord's love for his people. In fact, the Lord has a love even greater.

Even if a mother could forget her baby and not care about her child, it would be still impossible for the Lord to forget his people. A mother's love might seem to be never failing, but the Lord's love is even greater.

Throughout his Word, the Lord reminds us of the greatness, the certainty of his love for us. In Jeremiah the Lord says, "I have loved you with an ever lasting love" (Jeremiah 31:3 NIV 84). In the book of Romans, St. Paul emphatically states, "For I am convinced that neither death nor life, neither angels nor demons, neither the present nor the future, nor any powers, neither height nor depth, nor anything else in all creation, will be able to separate us from the love of God that is in Christ Jesus our Lord" (Romans 8:38-39 NIV 84).

Sad to say, there are some mothers and fathers who don't love their children as they should. There are times when people whom we thought loved us, fail us or hurt us or turn their backs on us. Human beings can let us down.

But the Lord never does. He says, "*I, the Lord, do not change*" (Malachi 3:6 NIV 84). God is love. It is part of his essence, his being as God. He is love and that never changes. No matter what, I can be sure God loves me and will always help me. Because he loves me, he uses his almighty power to control all things so that I will always be blessed in the way that he knows is best. God's love never changes and it never fails.

We are thankful for the love certain people show to us. The love of a parent or a spouse or a sibling is a wonderful thing. But their love can't begin to compare with God's love for us. His is a love even greater.

#### **LOCKDOWN PROCEDURE**

"If the owner of the house had known at what time of night the thief was coming, he would have kept watch. . . . So also you must be ready. . . (Matthew 24:43, 45 NIV 84).

Here at Trinity we are in the process of putting several "lockdown" procedures into effect. One of the most obvious is the locked doors between the south entry and the Fellowship Hall and the west doors nearest the school class rooms.

During regular school hours these doors will be locked. A "ring for assistance" button is located near the entrance of each set of doors if the church or the school secretaries are not immediately available. They will open the doors to persons who have business in the school.

Please do not be offended if someone asks your name or who you need/want to see. We don't always recognize all the school parents or even some congregational members.

Bear with us as these and other protections are put into place. This is an effort to keep God's children safe while in our care.

## **NOTES FROM THE VOTERS' ASSEMBLY**

The voters of Trinity met on Sunday, April 21, 2013, after church for their regular Quarterly Voters' Meeting. This serves as an update to the congregation on the events taking place during the meeting.

The following membership actions approved by the Church Council were ratified by the voters: Transfer in from Aaron Kjenstad from Faith Lutheran, Tacoma, WA; transfer to St. Paul's Lutheran, Mankato, MN for Alicia Guthmiller; transfer to St. Martins, Watertown, SD for Will Anderson; transfer to Crosswalk

Lutheran Ministries, LaVeen, AZ for Seth Gosch; release from membership by self-exclusion: Connie and Natalie Bruemmer, Marie, Dillon, and Drew Gehring, and Nathan Wood.

Various department reports were given:

Department of Worship and Spiritual

Life: elections are coming up in July for positions on the Church Council and the Department of Education; please consider being nominated when the Nominations Committee begins its work.

Department of Education: Voters approved the new tuition rates for the coming school year.

Department of Property Care: There are continuing sewer problems in the parsonage. The Trustees were asked to explore and get the problem fixed.

Department of Stewardship: The Treasurer's report shows that Trinity has been blessed with offerings year-to-date. The Building Fund shows a \$658,476 balance thus far with approximately \$230,000 in uncollected commitments. That leaves us about \$20,000 short of the total cost of the project. All members are encouraged to consider offerings to the building fund to make up the \$20,000.

**Old Business:** The report on our church bell shows repairing the bell would be quite costly. The Council will look at various options and present the findings to the congregation for action.

**New Business:** Approved the purchase of Christ Light Sunday School materials for the next Sunday School season.

Approved Trinity hosting an area Sunday School Teachers conference in September 2013.

Approved the Council to obtain shortterm (1-3 years) financing to pay building costs until all the commitments are received.
